### **ALL-NIGHTER PROGRAMME on Friday 5 August 2016**

- **From 6 pm.: To get you in the mood for Rio de Janeiro**, head to the TOM Café. The menu features Brazilian food and cocktails until 4 a.m. (Level +2). A charge will apply for the food and drinks.
- **From 6 to 10 p.m.: For those thirsty for culture**, 15-minute micro-tours of the "Destination Rio" exhibitions will be organised. Non-guided visits in the whole Museum will be free of charge from 6 p.m. to 1 a.m.
- **From 6 to 10 p.m.: For the sporty ones, two try-out workshops**
  - Capoeira with Mestre Papa, an instructor from Bahia - on the Forecourt
  - Samba de gafieira with dance teacher Marcos Simões - on the TOM Café's Terrace
- **From 10.30 p.m. till 12.30 a.m.: An outstanding free concert by Carlinhos Brown in the Club Coubertin - Level +2**

We all know him for his performance on the "La La La" hit song by Shakira for the Football World Cup in 2014. Carlinhos Brown also closed the Paralympic Games in London, and is one of the biggest stars in Brazil.

A genius musician and engaging man, he has chosen The Olympic Museum in Lausanne to experience the Opening Ceremony in Rio.

At this special concert, he will take the audience on a wild sarabande to unapologetically thrill them with the sounds of a contemporary and triumphant mix. To discover some of his performances, go to [his website](#).
