#### INTRODUCTION

Figure skating featured twice on the Olympic Summer Games programme: at the Olympic Games London 1908 and the Olympic Games Antwerp 1920. This discipline is therefore the oldest of the winter competitions at the Olympic Games. It has been staged at all the editions of the Olympic Winter Games since Chamonix 1924. The ice dance event was added for the Olympic Winter Games Innsbruck 1976, while the team event made its first appearance at Sochi 2014.

### **KEY STAGES**

Olympic Summer Games	1908: First appearance of skating at the Olympic Summer Games.								
	1920: Second appearance of skating at the Olympic Summer Games.								
Olympic Winter Games	1924: First skating events at the Olympic Winter Games.								
Ice dance	1974: At the IOC Executive Board meeting held in Lausanne in February, the ice dance event was added to the programme for the Olympic Winter Games Innsbruck 1976.								
Team event	2011: The team event made its debut on the programme for the Olympic Winter Games Sochi 2014 following a decision taken by the IOC Executive Board at its meeting in April in London.
