IOC Policy Regarding Certain NOC Scientific and Medical Equipment for the Games of the XXXII Olympiad Tokyo 2020, to be held in 2021

As a matter of general policy, it is prohibited for any National Olympic Committee (“**NOC**”) or member of its delegation to bring any of the following scientific or medical equipment (“**Equipment**”) in or around any Olympic Venue during the Period of the Games of the XXXII Olympiad Tokyo 2020, held in 2021:

- (i) Oxygen tanks and cylinders
- (ii) Hypoxic or hyperoxic tents or chambers
- (iii) Cryogenic chambers for whole body cryotherapy

It is the responsibility of each NOC to ensure compliance with this Policy by all members of its delegation. Failure to respect this Policy may expose the Athlete(s), the entourage of the Athlete(s), the NOC and members of its delegation as well as persons involved to disciplinary action in application of article 59 of the Olympic Charter.

Further information relating to the processing of personal data in the context of investigations related to alleged failure to respect this Policy and any subsequent sanction proceedings are described in the Information Notice on the processing of personal data of participants and other accredited persons for the Games of the XXXII Olympiad Tokyo 2020 (as attached to the Conditions of Participation form).

For the purposes of this Policy, the following definitions shall apply:

“*Olympic Venue*” shall mean all venues which require an Olympic accreditation card or ticket to gain entry, including the Olympic Village(s), Village Square, the competition venues and the training and practice venues.

“*Period of the Games of the XXXII Olympiad Tokyo 2020*” shall mean the period from the opening of the Olympic Village(s) on 13 July 2021, until the closing of the Olympic Village(s) on 11 August 2021.
